2. This guide covers Challenges 1 – 4, including items from the 'storyline'. This guide does not include items from the "Just4Fun" section. Always check with your Awana missionary, or event coordinator, to see what material will be covered in your area quizzing.
3. The material contained within this study guide was taken from the most recent printing of the Awana handbook at the time this guide was created.
4. This study guide was compiled from a combination of the handbook and the Leader's Guidebook.
 - a. The verses were compared to the KJV of the Bible as well as the handbook. In many cases, the handbook (and guide) capitalize words, referring to God and Jesus, which are not capitalized in the KJV Bible. Examples of these words are "He", "His", "Thou", "Thy", "Scripture" and similar
5. Words in the scripture verses that are *italicized* and underlined are found in the Word Wise Definitions.
6. **Always check the Awana handbook (and Bible) for accuracy.** While we have worked hard to check this guide for accuracy, we are but human and may have erred. The "final authority" is the Awana handbook. If you do find any errors, please let us know so we may correct this guide.

Intro (p. 2)	<input type="checkbox"/> The Ultimate Challenge is about our relationship with Jesus
Chal. 1 Intro (p. 8)	<input type="checkbox"/> We can't make up our own rules <input type="checkbox"/> That is why we need to learn truth from the Bible.
Challenge 1:2	<input type="checkbox"/> You need to study the Bible because SO many people are SO confused about what it says. <input type="checkbox"/> You want to KNOW what God tells us in His Word.
Challenge 1:4	<input type="checkbox"/> The people who wrote the Bible were eyewitnesses of different events. They actually saw some of the Bible "lived out".
Challenge 1:5	<input type="checkbox"/> Luke was a medical doctor. <input type="checkbox"/> Luke wrote two books of the Bible – Luke and Acts.
Challenge 1:6	<input type="checkbox"/> "Historically correct" doesn't mean the Bible is a history book, but when the Bible does talk about history, it is ALWAYS exactly correct.
Chal. 2 Intro (p. 26)	<input type="checkbox"/> What Bible story is told in the intro? Peter catching the fish with the tax money in its mouth. <input type="checkbox"/> The Bible isn't a science book, but when the Bible talks about science, what the Bible says is always exactly right.
Challenge 2:6	<input type="checkbox"/> The Bible (God's Word) changes people's lives. <input type="checkbox"/> No other book can change people the way the Bible can.
Chal. 2:7	<input type="checkbox"/> When someone trusts Christ as Savior, he or she becomes a new creation.
Challenge 3:2	<input type="checkbox"/> God offers us the ultimate gift – eternal life through His Son, Jesus Christ. <input type="checkbox"/> We don't deserve this gift. <input type="checkbox"/> God offers it to us because of His love and grace.
Challenge 3:3	<input type="checkbox"/> The purpose of the law is to show the seriousness of sin and lead us to Christ. <input type="checkbox"/> The law was not given to save people, but to show people they need a Savior.
Challenge 3:4	<input type="checkbox"/> The first four commandments are about our attitude toward God. <input type="checkbox"/> We are to honor and respect God in everything we say, do and think. <input type="checkbox"/> What things can you do to show honor to God? <i>(any of the following)</i> <i>Study and memorize verses / Sing praise songs / Attend church / Tell my friends about the Lord Jesus Christ</i>
Challenge 3:5	<input type="checkbox"/> The rest of the commandments (last 6) give us instructions for treating our family and neighbors with honor.
Challenge 3:6	<input type="checkbox"/> The law (The Commandments) showed us we are sinners in need of a Savior. <input type="checkbox"/> Because of His mercy, God sent His only Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to be our Savior. <input type="checkbox"/> We are saved by putting our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, our Savior – not by works
Chal. 4 Intro (p. 65)	<input type="checkbox"/> Bathsheba's husband, Uriah, was a Hittite. <input type="checkbox"/> Hittite's are mentioned 47 times in the Bible.
Challenge 4:2	<input type="checkbox"/> Only God can keep every promise He makes. <input type="checkbox"/> Only God is totally and absolutely faithful. <input type="checkbox"/> He promised to send a Savior, He did – He promises to love us, He does – He promises to be with us when things go wrong (and right), He is.
Challenge 4:5	<input type="checkbox"/> God is in charge which means He has authority. <input type="checkbox"/> God is YOUR authority, you are to obey what He says in His Word.
