Intro (p. 2)		The Ultimate Adventure is our relationship with Jesus
Chal. 1:2		We were created to glorify the Lord. He should come first in our lives
Challenge 1:3		You are God's gift to your parents. You are a reward from God to your mom & dad. You are a heritage to your mom and dad. God had a specific plan for your life when He put you in the care of your family.
Challenge 1:5		Some things you can talk about are: 1. What's happening in school or with your friends and 2. The pastor's message (ask your parents what you don't understand).
Chal. 2:2		Responsibility is the "ability to respond" willingly and without complaining.
Challenge 2:4		Growing up to soon only leads to trouble. The Bible tells us that boys should treat girls as sisters and girls should treat boys as brothers (1 Peter 3:8).

Baptism is your testimony to other people that you have trusted Christ. Baptism by immersion is being placed under the water and then immediately lifted up from the water.
Challenge 4:3		When you trust Christ as Savior, the Holy Spirit gives you one or more spiritual gifts. We are born with abilities and talents, these are not spiritual gifts, but may be how the spiritual gift is "worked out" in our lives.
Challenge 4:5		You need to talk to God everyday. You can talk to God about absolutely anything.
Challenge 4:6		The Lord designed us to be part of a growing church body. The Lord designed churches to be self-governing and responsible directly to the Lord. God wants us to worship together, study His word together, pray together, serve together and encourage one another.
