Intro (p. 2)	The Ultimate Challenge is about our relationship with Jesus
Chal. 1 Intro (p. 9)	 We can't make up our own rules That is why we need to learn truth from the Bible.
Challenge 1:2	 You need to study the Bible because SO many people are SO confused about what it says. You want to KNOW what God tells us in His Word.
Challenge 1:4	The people who wrote the Bible were eyewitnesses of different events. They actually saw some of the Bible "lived out".
Challenge 1:5	 Luke was a medical doctor. Luke wrote two books of the Bible – Luke and Acts.
Challenge 1:6	"Historically correct" doesn't mean the Bible is a history book, but when the Bible does talk about history, it is ALWAYS exactly correct.
Chal. 2 Intro (p. 26)	 What Bible story is told in the intro? Peter catching the fish with the tax money in its mouth. The Bible isn't a science book, but when the Bible talks about science, what the Bible says is always exactly right.
Challenge 2:6	 The Bible (God's Word) changes people's lives. No other book can change people the way the Bible can.
Chal. 2:7	When someone trusts Christ as Savior, he or she becomes a new creation.
Challenge 3:2	 God offers us the ultimate gift – eternal life through His Son, Jesus Christ. We don't deserve this gift. God offers it to us because of His love and grace.
Challenge 3:3	 The purpose of the law is to show the seriousness of sin and lead us to Christ. The law was not given to save people, but to show people they need a Savior.
Challenge 3:4	 The first four commandments are about our attitude toward God. We are to honor and respect God in everything we say, do and think. What things can you do to show honor to God? (any of the following) Study and memorize verses / Sing praise songs / Attend church / Tell my friends about the Lord Jesus Christ
Challenge 3:5	The rest of the commandments (last 6) give us instructions for treating our family and neighbors with honor.
Challenge 3:6	 The law (The Commandments) showed us we are sinners in need of a Savior. Because of His mercy, God sent His only Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, to be our Savior. We are saved by putting our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, our Savior – not by works
Chal. 4 Intro (p. 65)	 Bathsheba's husband, Uriah, was a Hittite. Hittite's are mentioned 47 times in the Bible.
Challenge 4:2	 Only God can keep every promise He makes. Only God is totally and absolutely faithful. He promised to send a Savior, He did – He promises to love us, He does – He promises to be with us when things go wrong (and right), He is.
Challenge 4:5	 God is in charge which means He has authority. God is YOUR authority, you are to obey what He says in His Word.
